



Introductory Training in Sterile Compounding Aseptic Technique

Registration Deadline: fourteen (14) days before the event or when capacity is met

Course Description: This 22-hour is designed to introduce and prepare pharmacy technicians, pharmacists, and healthcare personnel to perform foundational sterile compounding in compliance with USP <797>. Through a blend of pre-course home study and in-person training, participants develop essential knowledge in aseptic technique, cleanroom practices, environmental monitoring, and sterile compounding principles. During the in-person experience, participants practice and demonstrate core sterile compounding skills in a simulated cleanroom environment, including hand hygiene and garbing, environmental cleaning and disinfection, gloved fingertip test sampling, media fill testing, and preparation of compounded sterile preparations (CSPs).

Participants will demonstrate competency through structured practice and formal assessment, gaining the skills and confidence needed to pursue roles in sterile compounding settings. Upon successful completion of the program requirements, participants are eligible to receive a digital badge recognizing their achievement in foundational sterile compounding.

Target Audience: This course is designed to provide training for pharmacists, pharmacy technicians, and other health care professionals. This course is ACPE accredited for Pharmacists and Pharmacy Technicians.

Participation Requirements: Successfully complete the 10-hour home study before attending the live, in-person class. The participant must physically be able to stand for a minimum of 1 hour.

Location of Event: The 12-hour in-person training will be at the Aseptic Compounding Experience (ACE) Lab, located in the University of South Carolina College of Pharmacy: 715 Sumter Street Columbia, SC 29208.

Learning Objectives:

*At the conclusion of this activity, the **pharmacist** and **pharmacy technician** will be able to:*

1. Explain USP <797> requirements related to personnel training, competency assessment, and aseptic practice
2. Demonstrate proper hand hygiene and garbing procedures for sterile compounding
3. Identify primary engineering controls (PECs) and secondary engineering controls (SECs) used in sterile compounding
4. Describe ISO classifications and cleanroom design requirements for sterile compounding facilities
5. Perform environmental cleaning and disinfection procedures in accordance with USP <797> standards
6. Discuss environmental monitoring results associated with sterile compounding practices
7. Perform proper materials handling of supplies and equipment used in sterile compounding
8. Demonstrate aseptic manipulation techniques used in sterile compounding, including withdrawal from vials and ampules, reconstitution, and IV admixture preparation
9. Apply principles of first air, critical site protection, and airflow management during sterile compounding
10. Perform basic calculations for compounded sterile preparations (CSP)
11. Incorporate compatibility, stability, and beyond-use date (BUD) considerations into compounding decisions
12. Demonstrate competency in sterile compounding through simulation-based preparation and formal assessment
