Program Overview (Knowledge-Based Activity):

The Final Omnibus Rule of HIPAA (ACPE 0062-9999-18-093-L03-T, Law CE)

Workshop 2: South Carolina Legislative Update 2018 (ACPE 0062-9999-18-094-L03-T, Law CE)

Workshop 3: Common Childhood Illnesses Review for the Pharmacy Technician (ACPE 0062-9999-18-095-L01-T)

- Identify common childhood illnesses and the medications used to treat them

Workshop 4: Medical Marijuana Considerations for the Pharmacy Technician (ACPE 0062-9999-18-096-L01-T)

- Identify potential therapeutic applications of marijuana
- Describe the effects of marijuana on the central nervous system and other organ systems
- Recognize the advantages and disadvantages of different natural and synthetic cannabinoids and routes of administration
- Describe the differences and similarities among states that permit marijuana to be used for medical purposes
- Analyze the controversy between state and federal law as it applies to marijuana and the history behind regulation
